The Coolidge National Medal of Honor Heritage Center proudly presents its Keynote Speaker for the 2026 Patriots Ball: Medal of Honor Recipient David Bellavia.

Bellavia is the first and only living Iraq veteran to receive the Congressional Medal of Honor, which is our country's highest military honor. He was awarded the Medal of Honor at the White House on June 25, 2019, surrounded by his family and every living member of his Task Force.

Staff Sergeant Bellavia distinguished himself through extraordinary gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty while serving as a squad leader in support of Operation Phantom Fury in Fallujah, Iraq — November 10, 2004. During intense house-to-house combat in the Second Battle of Fallujah, his decisive and heroic actions directly saved the lives of members of his unit.

Bellavia enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1999 and chose to stay and fight following the Sept. 11 terror attacks. That sense of duty was ingrained in Bellavia by his World War II veteran grandfather, who served in the Army during the Normandy Campaign. Bellavia returned home in 2005 and founded the advocacy organization Vets for Freedom and in 2019 founded the Deuce Relief Fund, which supports the soldiers of his former Task Force 2-2 in Iraq.

Bellavia returned to Iraq as an embedded reporter covering heavy fighting in 2006 and 2008, and in 2007 wrote and published *House to House*, a book detailing his experiences in Fallujah. His book is considered one of the best first-hand military accounts ever written.



Bellavia's many awards and decorations include the Bronze Star, the National Defense Service Medal, Kosovo Campaign Medal with Bronze Service Star, New York State Conspicuous Service Cross, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and the NATO Medal. He was inducted into the New York State Veterans Hall of Fame in 2005.

Bellavia is a Western New York native. He is a 1994 graduate of Lyndonville High School in Orleans County and studied biology and theater at the University of Buffalo.

Today, he is active traveling the country as a speaker sharing the important message of service over self and as a sought-after source for national media.

Groundbreaking surgeon, staunch abolitionist, and revolutionary suffragist, Dr. Mary Edwards

Walker was an unceasing voice for the voiceless. A tireless advocate, Dr. Walker pushed the boundaries from a young age and became one of the first female surgeons in the United States. The outspoken doctor left her practice behind when the nation called upon its patriots to preserve the union. Surgeons often entered service as commissioned officers; however, Dr. Walker was refused. Determined to serve, and to prove a woman's place is anywhere that she decides, Dr. Walker accepted a contract. A commitment to her patients' health and recovery awarded her with the praise and devotion of many soldiers at her hospitals. This included those who arrived from the surrounding battlefields



at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Chattanooga in 1863. Captured by the Confederates and held at the notorious Castle Thunder, Dr. Walker's courage and defiance in the face of adversity saw her through to the end of the war. A grateful nation acknowledged Dr. Walker's invaluable service with the highest award for military valor—the Medal of Honor. However, the surgeon's commitment to the nation continued beyond the Civil War's conclusion. Her life as an ardent proponent of women's rights, dress reform, and other progressive movements propelled her onto the national stage. Undaunted by her detractors, Dr. Walker pushed her advocacy to the limits at the turn of the 20th century. By 1919, Dr. Walker's Medal of Honor had been struck from the record and she passed just over a year before women earned the right to vote. However, a true patriot continues to fight for a victory they may not see. Dr. Walker remained committed to her vision of a fair and equal United States of America with liberty and justice for all. Dr. Mary Edwards Walker's Medal of Honor was restored in 1977 and today she remains our nation's first, and only, female Medal of Honor recipient. ★

GEORGE JORDAN: *Fierce defender, and Catalyst for Change*

George Jordan joined the battered nation as a newly freed man in 1866. As Reconstruction began to piece American society back together, Jordan found a place among the ranks of the United States Colored Troops in Nashville. Soldiers from these highly decorated units were reformed into regiments that would achieve equal martial fame—the Buffalo Soldiers. Immediately proving himself to be a fierce leader, George Jordan achieved the rank of sergeant and was leading men in the west with the 9th US Cavalry by the 1880s. During the Indian Wars, Sgt. Jordan and Troop K willingly endured a forced march to reach Fort Tularosa before Chief Victorio and his Apache warriors attacked the town. Sgt. Jordan's resourcefulness and tireless defense saved the small, New Mexican settlement in 1880. Sgt. Jordan's



courage and cool leadership under fire averted a disastrous enemy ambush at Carrizo Canyon just a year later in 1881. The cavalrymen outmaneuvered the Apaches, commanded by Victorio's successor Nana, and successfully covered the retreat of the remaining Buffalo Soldiers. Sgt. Jordan received the Medal of Honor in 1890 for both actions and is one of only 23 Buffalo Soldiers to receive the honor for service in the Indian Wars. Sgt. George Jordan ended his service in 1897 after more than 30 years in the US Army, an exemplar of inspiring citizenship. ★

DESMOND DOSS: *Selfless Healer Amidst the Chaos of Battle*

Committed to his faith and unflinching in his resolve, Desmond T. Doss cut an unassuming figure amongst the hardened soldiers of the late war. With the fighting ongoing against the imperial forces of Japan, Corporal Doss' island hopping landed him on the shores of Okinawa in 1945 and with two Bronze Stars to his name. A willing volunteer and firm conscientious objector, Cpl. Doss refused to carry a weapon and instead trained to be a medic during a conflict in which healers became valuable targets. Unbothered by this danger, Doss spent nearly a month under enemy fire rescuing and treating his men during his Medal of Honor action. The rocky and unforgiving walls of Hacksaw Ridge forced the Americans on the backfoot after taking numerous casualties at the summit. Committed to



saving the wounded, Cpl. Doss aided and lowered dozens of soldiers down the escarpment while under enemy fire. On the battlefields beyond Hacksaw Ridge during this "Typhoon of Steel," a resolute Desmond Doss readily sacrificed himself to aid the wounded. Grievously injured numerous times, Cpl. Doss weathered the storm of war and saved many lives. Cpl. Doss received the Medal of Honor from President Truman in the autumn of 1945. Corporal Desmond T. Doss became known as the "Hero Without a Gun" and his Medal of Honor citation uniquely states that the conscientious objector and valiant soldier went "far above and beyond the call of duty." ★

CHARLES COOLIDGE: *Fearless and Cool in the Face of Overwhelming Odds*

Chattanooga local, Charles H. Coolidge became the city's first Medal of Honor recipient thanks to his fearless and compassionate leadership during WWII. With gallant service in North Africa and Italy, Technical Sergeant Charles Coolidge found himself at the borders of the enemy's homeland. In the Vosges Mountains, T/Sgt. Coolidge took command and led a stalwart defense of a critical hilltop less than 100 miles from the border of France and Germany in late 1944. Faced with overwhelming odds, T/Sgt Coolidge organized his men as they dug into their positions. The Chattanooga initially asked the enemy if they preferred to surrender, but acted quickly when he observed an impending attack. Skirmishes resulted in standstills until enemy tanks arrived to dislodge the determined



Americans. This time a tank commander asked T/Sgt. Coolidge if he wished to surrender the dogged defenders. "You're going to have to come and get me" replied the Tennessean. Cool under pressure, T/Sgt. Coolidge exhausted all ammunition and every avenue of defense after numerous enemy assaults. Committed to saving the lives of his outnumbered men, he ordered them off the hill after a successful defense. T/Sgt. Coolidge and his soldiers held Hill 623 for five days. T/Sgt. Charles H. Coolidge received the Medal of Honor on a captured German airfield in 1945, a little over a month after VE Day. ★

Ray Duke: *Unrelenting Leadership, Unhesitating Self-Sacrifice*

A native of nearby Whitwell, Tennessee, and WWII veteran, Ray E. Duke remained steadfast in his service and was stationed in the Pacific after the Second World War. The North Korean attack on the Republic of Korea in 1950 required swift and decisive action, with Master Sergeant Duke's division placed at the tip of the spear. Although the 24th Infantry Division was without proper equipment and weaponry to adequately stem the tide, the division continued to fight and stall until reinforcement. Amid US operations that pitted UN forces against an indefatigable North Korean army, MSgt. Duke's action took place on July 22, 1950. When several of his men were held up behind enemy lines, MSgt. Duke led a courageous rescue. Faced with overwhelming enemy numbers, Duke unwaveringly aided and organized



his men under fire and sustained debilitating injuries in the process. With the realization that the enemy would overrun the position, Duke ordered the men to leave him and return to safety. MSgt. Duke defended their retreat and was captured by the enemy. MSgt. Duke died, like many imprisoned US personnel, in a POW camp on an unknown date. Veterans Day, November 11, 1951, is officially listed as MSgt. Duke's date of death. MSgt. Ray E. Duke is one of very few US personnel to receive both the Medal of Honor and the Taegeuk Cordon of the Order of Military Merit, the Republic of Korea's highest award for military valor. ★


Larry Taylor: *Unflinching Dedication to Brothers-In-Arms*

Born and raised in Chattanooga, Larry L. Taylor began his military career as a teen in this city. Committed to service, Captain Taylor commissioned as an officer out of the University of Tennessee and found his place behind the sticks of a new type of armored cavalry. A pilot of one of nine experimental gunships in Vietnam, Cpt. Taylor's Dark Horse 32 comprised two AH-1G helicopters. When a distress call came one night from an ambushed squad of heavily outnumbered LRRP's, Cpt. Taylor and Dark Horse 32 rushed to their aid. The gunships provided devastating fire, but with ammunition expended the gunships were ordered home. Committed to these men and dissatisfied with leaving them behind, Cpt. Taylor devised a courageous rescue. While the LRRPs created a distraction, and the second Cobra continued its



feints against the enemy, Cpt. Taylor landed the two-seater craft under fire. The four men climbed aboard the skids and rocket pods and Cpt. Taylor coolly guided the craft to safety. The four LRRPs disembarked at a nearby water treatment plant and saluted their rescuers before the Cobra faded back into the darkness. When dressed down upon his return to base, Cpt. Taylor simply responded: "Want me to take 'em back?" Recognized originally with the Silver Star, Captain Larry L. Taylor's award was upgraded in September of 2023 to the Medal of Honor. ★
